### About the Brandenburg

The Australian Brandenburg Orchestra, led by charismatic Artistic Director Paul Dyer, celebrates the music of the 16<sup>th</sup>, 17<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup> centuries with excellence, flair and joy.

We are the Australian Brandenburg Orchestra — Australia's national Baroque music flagship and a world leader in historically informed performance. Under the inspired leadership of our co-founder and Artistic Director Paul Dyer, we bring to life the music of the I6<sup>th</sup>, I7<sup>th</sup> and I8<sup>th</sup> centuries with flair, precision and unmistakable joy.

Since our debut at the Sydney Opera House in 1990, we've grown into one of the country's most celebrated performing arts companies. Our musicians are some of Australia's finest period specialists, performing on instruments of the era and using editions based on original manuscripts. We aim to recreate the sounds that composers like Bach and Vivaldi would have known, but with an energy and immediacy that speaks directly to today's audiences.

Our name honours JS Bach's *Brandenburg Concertos*, and like those iconic works, we're known for combining elegance with spirit, tradition with innovation. Each year, we perform for over 58,000 people across our mainstage seasons in Sydney and Melbourne. Our reach continues to grow through regional Australia and Queensland touring, and via our digital platform Brandenburg One, which brings our music to audiences wherever they are.

We're passionate about making music that's not only rooted in the past but alive in the present. That's why we're committed to creating new Australian content — commissioning local composers and collaborating with theatre designers, authors, and directors to produce imaginative, theatrically-staged productions.

We love working across genres and art forms, and recent partnerships with Circa contemporary circus, Whirling Dervishes from Konya, Türkiye, and French Movement artist Silvère Jarrosson have expanded the ways we tell musical stories and connect with audiences.

We've had the privilege over time of sharing the stage with extraordinary guest artists including Yvonne Kenny, Andreas Scholl, Avi Avital, Leila Schayegh, Philippe Jaroussky, Kristian Bezuidenhout, Elinor Frey, Shunske Sato, Simone Kermes, Francesco Corti, and Samuel Mariño. Like us, they bring both authenticity and boldness to the world of early music.

Our recording catalogue includes 20 albums with ABC Classic, five of which have won ARIA Awards for Best Classical Album. Most recently, we were proud to record music for the global documentary film *Mozart's Sister*, contributing our sound to the story of Maria Anna 'Nannerl' Mozart — a remarkable musician whose voice is being rediscovered by audiences worldwide.

We're also honoured recipients of the Sidney Myer Performing Arts Group Award and the Helpmann Award for Best Chamber Concert. In 2003, we joined the Major Performing Arts Group (now the National Performing Arts Partnership Framework), reflecting our place as one of Australia's leading cultural institutions.





# Vivaldi's Legacy The woman behind the music.

In this intimate and poetic program, acclaimed Parisbased violinist Augusta McKay Lodge makes her

Australian debut as soloist and Guest Director, shining

a light on one of Baroque music's most fascinating and

overlooked figures — Anna Maria della Pietà.

A virtuoso who lived and performed at the Venetian orphanage where Vivaldi taught, Anna Maria inspired some of his finest and most demanding works. But she was more than just Vivaldi's student. Celebrated in her time, Anna Maria played multiple instruments with extraordinary skill and had music written specifically for her by composers across Europe.

Led with elegance and insight by Augusta McKay Lodge, this refined program offers a rare glimpse into the sound world of Anna Maria. Through solo and chamber works full of nuance and colour, we hear the brilliance of a woman whose artistry helped shape Vivaldi's enduring legacy.

This is a concert of detail, grace, and imagination. Multiinstrumental, historically inspired, and threaded with narration, *Vivaldi's Legacy* invites you into the life of a remarkable artist and the music she brought to life.

# Mozart, Salieri & Pleyel

A classical powerbouse.

Experience the full force of the Brandenburg in a dramatic and large-scale Classical concert that pairs familiar brilliance with rediscovered treasure.

Anchored by Mozart's Symphony No. 39 — one of his most majestic and emotionally charged works — this program features the Australian premiere of a cracking Sinfonia by Antonio Salieri (unheard until 2024) and the world premiere of a recently unearthed concerto by Ignaz Pleyel to be played by the Brandenburg's Principal Bass Robert Nairn. Lost to time and never before performed, Pleyel's work will finally be added to the rich tapestry of Classical repertoire.

With an expanded orchestral palette including full winds, brass, timpani, and a 19-piece string section, this concert offers a bold and resonant sound that fills the hall with drama, elegance, and power.

Mozart, Salieri & Pleyel is more than a tribute to these great Classical masters. It offers a revelatory journey, inviting audiences to experience this golden age of music with fresh ears and to uncover the timeless surprises the Classical world still holds.
